"Thrifty people in Morrow county bought \$6,565 worth of U S Treasury series E and H Savings Bonds during the month of July," county chairman Jack Bedford announced here today.

Total sale in Oregon was \$2,728,764 for the month," the chairman continued.

"Purchases of savings bonds within the state for the first seven months of the year total \$20,998,959.

"Throughout the nation Americans now own Series E and H bonds with a total cash value of \$42.7 billion.

Sales in Morrow county during July were \$11,000 less than for the same month last year, but total sales so far during 1960 are about \$2,000 ahead of 1959.

He told his audience that he expected to defeat incumbent Al Ullman, Democrat, whom he characterized as "one of the wild spenders of taxpayers' dollars." He predicted that the margin of victory would "keep everybody up pretty late election night," adding, "I would not expect to win and I propose to win by hard work, taking the issues to the people."

Phair said "no more taxes" is an important slogan. He also urged that the line on inflation must be held. He said if the Democratic platform should be enacted vast new tax increases could be expected "within a very short time."

Mr Phair returns here for the Morrow county Fair this month and hopes to make two other campaign trips to Heppner before election day.
