### Totem Burger Treat



Tan them and top them and tote them away, that's how to make burgers the totem pole way.

#### Totem Burgers

- 2 pounds ground beef
- 2 teaspoons Ac'cent
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 8 slices (8 ounces) process American cheese
- 8 Hamburger buns

Break up meat with fork in mixing bowl. Sprinkle Ac'cent, salt and pepper over entire surface of meat. Toss gently with fork to distribute seasonings. Shape into 8 patties. Pan broil, broil or grill to desired doneness. Just before hamburgers are done, top with cheese. Butter each hamburger bun and cover bottom half with lettuce. Top with hamburger patty, spread with mustard. Top with onion and tomato slices, pickle relish and olive. Repeat for each serving. Yield: 8 servings.

### Boardman Schools Ready For Opening On September 6

Riverside high school and Boardman grade school will open Sept 6. All high school students are asked to come to the high

school office to register Sept 2, 8:45 a m to 3:30 p m. Parents are invited to accompany their children to register. Teachers will be present to assist with schedules. Fees are as follows: books, \$5.00; activity, \$5.00; towels, \$2.00. Students may or may not pay the "annual fee" of \$3.00. No charge is made for lockers, but in some cases students must have lock and key. Each high school student has his own locker. All insurance for both grade and high school students is paid by the Morrow county school board. This includes athletic insurance. Meals in the cafeteria will be 25c for all students, 30c for adults. Buses will not run until the first day of school, Sept 6.

New teachers this year are Bill White, music; Dallas Haverland, mathematics and social science; Richard Waymire, seventh and eighth grades. Haverland, who taught at Mitchell last year, comes from Athena. Waymire taught at Irrigon last year.

Other teachers are: Jack Flug, superintendent, business law; Ronald Black, FFA and shop; Mrs Ruth Coy, English, book-keeping and typing; Lester Leroux, science and world history; Mrs Della Lindsay, home economics and English; Robert Strutz, coach, also world geography, United States history, seventh and eighth grade social studies, and boys' physical education.

Grade school teachers are Zoe Billings, first and second; Mildred Baker, third and fourth; LaVerne Partlow, fifth and sixth, and girls' physical education. Cafeteria cooks are Mrs Charles Graham and Mrs Jack Taylor. Robert Harwood is custodian. Bus drivers are Harwood and Ed
