Line broiler pan with aluminum foil. Turn temperature control to
"broil" and place broiler pan 7 to 8 inches from heat. Place chicken, skin side down, on pan. Combine remaining ingredients; brush half the herb mixture over chicken. Broil 30 minutes. Turn chicken and brush with remaining mixture. Broil 15 to 20 minutes longer. Yield: 4 servings, 275 calories per serving.


