

Triple Treat Salad Platter

A colorful vegetable-consomme ring mold surrounds chicken salad, with dev-iled eggs on fluffy greens finishing off the pretty platter. As the ring mold is tart and tangy keep the chicken salad simple. To make

it for four to six use 2 cans (5 to 6 oz. each) boned chicken, sliced

Ruby Ring With Chicken Salad

Sprinkle gelatin over consomme and water in a saucepan. Place over low heat, stirring until gelatin is dissolved. Remove from heat and add salt and vinegar; chill until partially thickened. Fold in finely chopped onion, cucumber and drained beets. Pour into ring mold and chill until firm. Unmold on serving plate and fill center of ring with chicken salad. Garnish with salad greens and deviled eggs. Four to six servings.
