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
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Stroganoff Good Patio Fare



Pleasantly warm summer evenings are perfect for porch or patio-dining, and balmy breezes what appetites sometimes subdued dur-ing the heat of the day.

What about serving everybody's favorite, Beef Stroganoff? It is a hearty enough dish to please the hungriest of men but lends itself to informality serving because it can be served in one dish. Pickled beets and sour cream are suitable accompaniments.

To any meal served indoors or out, seasoning is important. A versatile one is Tabasco, a liquid red pepper seasoning. It is particularly good with dishes that combine meat and vegetables in one because flavors are apt to become indistinct and need spark such as Tabasco provides.

Beef Stroganoff

2 teaspoons salt
1½ pounds sirloin or rib steak,
or boneless chuck, cut
into strips
4 tablespoons butter or

margarine edium onion, sliced

1 garlic clove, minced
1 can condensed tomato or cream of chicken soup
4 cup bouillon
4 teaspoon Tabasco
1 pound mushrooms, sliced 3 cups hot cooked rice 1 cup commercial sour cream Combine flour and salt; sprinkle meat with flour mixture. Melt butter in skillet; add onion and garlic. Cook until onion is tender, but not brown. Remove from skillet; add meat and brown well. Stir in soup, bouillon, Tabasco and onion. Cover; simmer 30 minutes, or until meat is tender. (Simmer 1 hour for chuck). Add mushrooms; cook 10 minutes longer. To serve, spoon rice around edge of serving platter; turn beef mixture into center. Serve with sour cream. Yield: 6 servings.
