Good Eating From Idaho



There's good eating aplenty in this Red Bean Salad, crunchy-crisp with celery, sweet Spanish onions, and pickles; laced with zesty French dressing. Idaho's pride-of-the-crop, tender, plump red beans have a flavor all their own—unique, full-bodied, satisfying. Besides, there's nourishing goodness in every forkful. Unseen, there are proteins, food energy, B-vitamins, minerals. So much for so little, pocketbook-wise.

You won't need much else beside the dessert of your choice when you partner this hearty salad with another of Idaho's famous "crops"—lamb, a leg roasted the day before, refrigerated, thin-sliced. Add relishes, hot garlic-buttered French bread; serve it buffet style. You've never had it so good!

Red Bean Salad, Idaho-Style
 2 to 2 1/2 cups grown-in-Idaho cooked or canned red beans
 1 1/2 cups coarsely-cut celery
 1 cup sliced-on-the-bias sweet Spanish onions
 1/2 cup French dressing
 1/2 cup sweet pickles, sliced
 1/2 cup small cubes of sharp Cheddar cheese, if desired
 1 tablespoon sweet pickle liquid

Drain cooked or canned red beans. Combine with other ingredients, adding coarse-grind black pepper and salt as needed. Allow to stand in the refrigerator several hours or overnight. Garnish with onion rings, hard-cooked egg slices, if desired. Makes 6 hearty servings.

To prepare Idaho red beans: wash 2 cups dry red beans. Add 6 cups cold water. Let soak overnight. Or, if more convenient, place beans and water over high heat. Bring to boiling point. Boil briskly 2 minutes only. Remove from heat. Allow to soak 1 hour. For either soaking method, to cook beans—bring to boiling point over high heat. Reduce heat to simmer. Add 1 teaspoon butter to keep down foaming. Cover tightly. Cook 1 hour. Add 1 teaspoon salt. Continue cooking for 1 1/2 to 2 hours or until beans are tender but not mushy. Altitude and hardness of water will affect time. For salad, drain beans, saving liquid. This will make around 6 cups cooked beans. Use liquid with remaining beans to make up a favorite casserole dish for another meal.

Hog, Cattle, Sheep Price Outlook Told; Beef Decline Seen

Oregon market prospects are better for hogs than for cattle and sheep in the year ahead, but the long-term outlook remains favorable for all parts of the state's meat animal industry, say Oregon State College economists.

Record large beef supplies now in the making throughout the country point to gradual decline in beef prices for the next three or four years.

Supply of beef per person in the U. S. next year appears certain to pass the 1956 record of 85.4 pounds, reports M. D. Thomas, OSC extension agricultural economist. However, beef prices in 1961 are not likely to drop as low as in 1956, the economist explains. Less pork on the market, plus willingness and ability of food buyers to spend more money

for beef in recent years, will probably keep prices above 1956 levels.

Lamb prices are headed down along with beef. Slaughter lambs and steers at Portland have been bringing about \$3 a hundred-weight less than last summer. Oregon hog prices, now in a

seasonal decline should be followed by a rise this winter to levels possibly above recent July peaks, the economist believes. By next summer, swine breeding stock should be higher and some of the highest market hog prices could be past for awhile, Thomas adds.

Detailed discussion of Oregon's livestock outlook is included in the current issue of the Oregon Farm and Market Outlook circular published by OSC extension service. Also included are reports on seed crops, grain, and hay and the general economic outlook. Free copies are available at county extension offices. Oregon, Washington, and California populations have increased more than one-third in the past decade and the gain is expected to continue nearly as fast in the next 10 years. Per capita income also has increased rapidly and is well above average.

Taking a longer look at market prospects for Oregon livestock, the economist points out that local cattle and hog raisers are located near the West Coast's "fastest growing group of highly-paid meat eaters" in the country. Oregon, Washington, and California populations have increased
