

**Hermiston Man on
FHA Area Committee**

John F. Walchli has been appointed as a member of the FHA area committee for Grant-Morrow-Umatilla counties. He succeeds Mr. Charles L. Hunt who has served his three-year term as committeeman.

Mr. Walchli operates a family-type farm at Hermiston.

Two other members make up the three-member committee, which works with the county supervisor to see that the best possible use is made of the agency's farm credit service program consistent with local farmers' needs. The other two members are Henry P. Kopacz, Hermiston, and Robert C. Smith, Irrigon.

The committee determines the eligibility of individual applicants for all types of loans. It also reviews borrowers' progress and aids the county supervisor in adapting the agency's loan policies to conditions faced by farmers in this area. Members are selected and appointed so that, so far as possible, different areas or neighborhoods are represented.

The Farmers Home Administration makes annual or intermediate term loans to farmers who need adequate funds to buy equipment and livestock, and longer term loans to build or repair houses and other essential farm buildings, and to purchase or improve land suitable for family-type farm operations.

It also advances credit to farmers or their non-profit associations to establish and carry out approved soil and water conservation practices, and to install and improve irrigation and farmstead water facilities.

**Assessors Training
Course Scheduled
Sept 12-16 at OSC**

OREGON STATE COLLEGE—County assessors and real estate appraisers from across Oregon will participate in the fifth annual state appraisal short course Sept. 12 to 16 at Oregon State College.

The course is sponsored jointly by the State Tax Commission and OSC to provide a continuous training program for appraisers and to help bring about greater uniformity in valuation of real property throughout the state.

Appraisal of residential property in or adjacent to commercial areas will draw special attention this year. Last year's related training covered effects of widespread development of outlying city shopping centers on downtown property values.

Effect of new farming techniques on the valuation of farm buildings also will be covered. Methods the appraiser should follow in measuring the amount of absenteeism in older farm construction will be explained in a series of lectures and workshops.

Practice appraisal of residential property in "changing neighborhoods" and of farm buildings will be included.

Dr. Grant E. Blanch, professor of agricultural economics at Oregon State College, is short course director. Representatives of the Oregon County Assessors Association helped develop the program.

Martin D. Miller, Chicago realtor and former assessor of Cook County, Ill., will be one of the course leaders again this year. Charles Mack, chairman of the State Tax Commission, will give the opening address.
