Elks Conduct A Varied Program; To Visit Hawaii

February, 1961, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will celebrate its 93rd birthday. From several members and one lodge this great fraternity has grown to 2,300 lodges and 1 1/2 million members, all working for the same cause—charity and brotherly love. The Elks National Foundation, which is worth many millions of dollars has all been donated by these members. The income from this foundation is used for youth activities only, throughout the United States.

The Oregon State Elks Association constitutes 50 lodges and 52,000 members. We have many worthy projects of which I will name a few, and their functions. First, I will mention our visually handicapped children's program for the needy in connection with the University of Oregon Medical School at Portland, Oregon. Since the beginning of this program some 11 years ago, we have sponsored over 45,000 patient visits. Last year 860 new children made their first visit to this clinic and the number of patient visits totaled 3,000.

117 major eye operations were performed. This service is given to the needy only. The Elks have purchased many thousands of dollars worth of highly specialized equipment for this clinic.

The second phase of this program is the training of physicians, nurses, and technicians. During the past year, three physicians completed at least one year's training in the Children's Eye Clinic. These doctors plan to practice in the Northwest. The Elk's nursery program in conjunction with the blind school in Salem has reached a new level of 14 needy children being placed in this nursery last year.

The Oregon state Elks association scholarship committee each year selects three girls and three boys by competitive examinations and awards scholarships to them. Youth activities are varied and many—youth leadership, boy scout troops, Babe Ruth baseball, Boys State and Elks national youth day, May 1. We celebrate throughout the state with programs in honor of the Youth of our State.

Disabled Veteran program for

the shut-ins at veteran's hospitals throughout the state for the entertainment and welfare of these deserving veterans where in the different lodges furnish entertainment and Christmas parties, including gifts is another project. For several years our committee has collected hides during the hunting season. Last year's total was 11,700 hides collected, which were then tanned and processed and sent to the different Veteran's hospitals to be worked on by the handicapped. The past several years we have purchased woodworking tools, other tools, sewing machines, etc. to be used by these shut-ins.

The Association will leave January first on their fifth annual visitation to Honolulu. All Elks, wives, and friends are welcome to join this tour. In past years this tour has been most successful and lots of fun.
