A new generation of Oregonians intent on development and conservation of the state's natural resources will take top billing at the annual convention of the Oregon Association of Soil Conservation Districts Nov. 16-18 at The Dalles.

A state speech contest on wildlife conservation and soil judging contests are among main events for young people at the association's 12th annual meeting.

Finals of the association's statewide speaking contest will bring together seven regional winners—of high school age or younger—on Nov. 17, reported Lloyd Gift, Bonanza, speech contest chairman.

Main events the opening day, Nov. 16, will be soil judging contests.

Contest divisions include 4-H club teams, Future Farmers of America teams, FFA individuals, and a special contest for high school vocational agriculture instructors.

Other divisions are for men, women, and two-member teams of Soil Conservation District supervisors. The contest is sponsored by the SCD Association, Pacific Supply Cooperative, Oregon State College extension service, and the Soil Conservation Service. The Heppner Soil Conservation District will enter a two member team.

Alvin Wagenblast, supervisor; John Wightman and Newt O'Hara, advisory supervisors; Ralph Richards, work unit conservationist, and N. C. Anderson, secretary, have indicated they will attend from the Heppner Soil Conservation District.
