**Space Age Park Power Service Bulletin Issued**

The Columbia Basin Electric Cooperative, Inc. and Umatilla Electric Cooperative Association of Heppner and Hermiston have released a descriptive brochure on power service for Oregon's Space Age Park.

Entitled "A Blueprint for Electric Power Service," the brochure stresses the availability of power service to the space age park and its environs over existing facilities of the publicly-owned utility systems. The brochure states the cooperatives "stand ready, willing and able" to expand or modify facilities to meet any prospective industrial and other loads of the area.

Schematic maps of the brochure graphically show the major facilities of the cooperatives as these encircle the area designated as Oregon's Space Age Industrial Park. Indicating that the cooperatives are preference customers of the U. S. Bonneville Power Administration, the brochure depicts the close proximity of their system to McNary dam and substation, and the relationship to the federal regional power system.

Managers Harley Young and Ray Woolley of the individual cooperatives indicated the brochure is a joint presentation of the two cooperatives, and is being transmitted to Oregon's congressional delegation, Governor Hatfield, the state department of planning and development and others.

Copies will be made available to interested industrialists and others concerned in the development of the Space Age Industrial Park.

**Christmas Club Checks Will Set All-Time High**

Santa Claus will arrive early in November for 30,000 Oregonians when the postman delivers First National Bank of Oregon Christmas Club checks totalling \$2,708,000, according to local branch manager J. H. Bedford.

The amount is a new all-time record distribution for any Oregon bank, topping last year's First National Christmas Club savings mark by 20 per cent. The total number of persons participating in the plan is up 13 per cent over last year's figure, the branch manager said.

The checks to be mailed from First National's 84 offices throughout the state will include the amount saved regularly during the past year, plus a total of over \$40,000 in interest. Christmas Club members will have an opportunity to complete their Christmas shopping before the normal yule season rush begins, the banker declared.

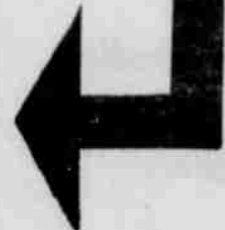
