Jim Derbin of Prineville came in last week after his wife and two daughters who had spent some time here with her mother, Mrs. Beeta Hinton.

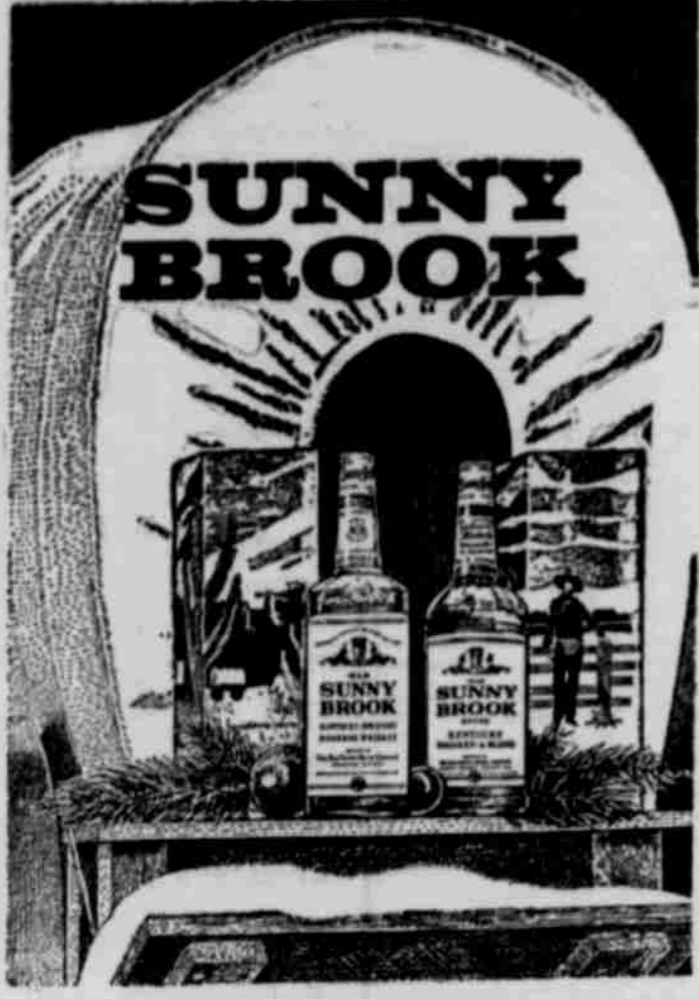
Maynard Hamilton and Ivan Benadect drove to Halfway Wednesday for a Presbytery meeting of the district.
