Renewal Reminders To Car Owners Before License Expires

The first phase of the Department of Motor Vehicles conversion to machine processing has now been completed, assuring much faster service to Oregon residents transacting vehicle registration business.

Vern L. Hill, director of the department, said his agency now has a complete master file of punched cards on all passenger cars registered in the state. This has made it practical for the department to send renewal reminders to car owners a month before license plates expire.

The conversion, which started a year ago, slowed service temporarily.

Hill said that as of this week title transfers that are in order are being processed in 10 to 12 days. When mailed, the new renewal notice is processed at the Salem office in one day. Car owners who take renewal notices to field offices receive valid registration cards on-the-spot.

Hill stressed the value of using the renewal notice as the key to speedy service.

The director thanked the public for its patience during

the conversion and added that the new registration service made possible by the conversion is only one of several changes being made to "provide more efficient service to the more than a million Oregon residents who transact business with the department each year."

ALL BANKS IN OREGON TO CLOSE SATURDAYS BEGINNING JANUARY 21, 1961

Five-day week to be observed by Banks throughout State

Beginning with Saturday, January 21, 1961, all banks in Oregon will observe a five-day banking week, Monday through Friday. The new five-day banking policy is in keeping with the prevailing practice of banks nationally, and is virtually universal in the Western states.

Additional hours of banking service on Fridays or other week days will be provided by many of the undersigned banks to fit the needs of their communities.

Perhaps the main consideration in establishing a regular five-day week was the wishes of bank employees. Under present conditions many fam-

ilies with both husband and wife employed find it impossible to spend their weekends together. Then, too, a system of staggered days off during the week has made it difficult to maintain the continuity of service you should expect.

In addition to extended Friday hours, such other services as bank-by-mail, 24-hour depositories, speedy bank-from-your-car facilities, etc., are available to make five-day banking suit your requirements.

Your bank will appreciate having you discuss with them any special problems you feel that you might have in connection with the Saturday closing.
