**Monthly Benefits To Disabled Workers Under Age 50**

The 1960 Amendments to the Social Security Act will provide payment of monthly benefits to permanently and totally disabled workers who are under age 50 and to certain dependent members of their families beginning with the check for the month of November 1960, according to Vernon Welo, District Manager, Social Security Administration, La Grande.

Until now only those disabled workers between 50 and 65 and their dependents were eligible for monthly payments.

Mr. Welo said that if you are under 50 and have already had your social security record frozen you will receive a letter explaining the new benefits and what you need to do about applying for them for yourself and dependents.

If a severely disabled worker under social security for at least 5 years out of 10 years before he became disabled has never applied to have his record frozen, he should get in touch with the nearest social security district office now to inquire about their rights to payments.

To qualify for disability insurance benefits, a disabled worker must be so severely disabled that he is unable to engage in any substantial activity. Also he must have worked under social security for at least 5 years out of 10 before he became disabled.

The 1960 Amendments, according to Mr. Welo, also makes provisions for severely disabled persons to continue to draw their benefit payments for 12 months whether they go to work under a vocational rehabilitation plan or on their own.

**Boating Accidents So Far This Year Claim 21 Lives**

The Marine Board in releasing statistics compiled from boating accident reports states that during the first nine months of this year pleasure boating accidents in Oregon claimed 21 lives.

The report listed small outboard boats of less than 16 feet in length as having the majority of accidents. Of the 104 accident reports received, 70 were from operators of boats in that category. Boats between 16 and 26 feet in length were involved in 27 accidents and those over 26 feet in length, 7 accidents.

There were 78 collisions reported of which 58 involved two or more vessels. Fourteen cases of capsizing, 4 of persons falling overboard, 2 cases of swamping and 2 of fire in outboard motor-boats reported. Water skiers were involved in 36 of the accidents.

Fourteen lives were lost during capsizing, 4 from falling overboard, 2 while engaged in skiing, and 1 from swamping. There were 35 injuries also reported.

The Marine Board study indicates that the major causes of boating accidents are overloading the boat, making extremely sharp turns, standing in a small boat, boating in bad weather and reckless operation which accounted for some of the collisions.

The Board's study also indicated that, in all probability, 16 lives would have been saved had the victims, who were in small boats, been wearing life preservers.

On the brighter side, the Marine Board reports that, although there was an increase in pleasure boating this year, there were less lives lost than in 1959.

Boating laws and regulations, while very necessary, will not prevent casualties if the boater himself does not know or practice the fundamentals of safe boating. It is the opinion of Marine Board Director, Bob Rittenhouse, who compiled the report, that the biggest job now before the Board is to bring about the practice of safe boating.

The Marine Board is now working on several safety programs which will begin this winter. It is the hope of the Board that the boating public will take advantage of these and any other educational programs available that will help decrease boating accidents.
