**Area Bank Debts Increased in October**

**UNIVERSITY OF OREGON,** Eugene (Special)—Bank debts for the Pendleton area including Umatilla, Morrow counties increased by 13.8 per cent in Oct. 1960 as compared to September, 1960 and decreased by 2.3 per cent a year ago.  
 Debts for October, 1960 totaled \$35,964,941; for September 1960 the total was \$31,606,383; and for October, 1959 the total amounted to \$36,829,375.  
 Oregon, with 202 banks reporting, had a decrease in bank debts in October, 1960 of 0.7

per cent compared with September, 1960 and a decrease of 4.8 per cent over October, 1959. Total debts for Oregon in October, 1960 came to \$2,065,647,625; September, 1960 totaled \$2,081,625,666; and October, a year ago, reached \$2,169,467,721.  
 Bank debts represent the dollar value of checks drawn against the deposit accounts of individuals and business firms. Bank debts are considered good indicators of current business activity. Each month the Bureau of Business Research at the University of Oregon collects data on bank debts from Oregon banks and branches.
