Plans are moving ahead at the Ione school for the Thursday evening, January 5, 1961 Lights On for Education program, according to local chairman, Joe Hausler.

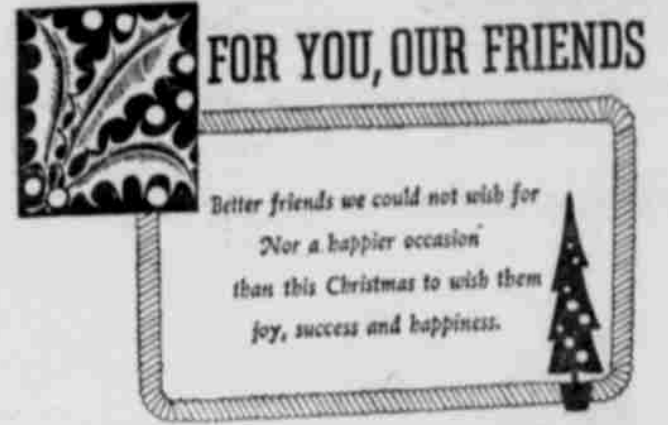

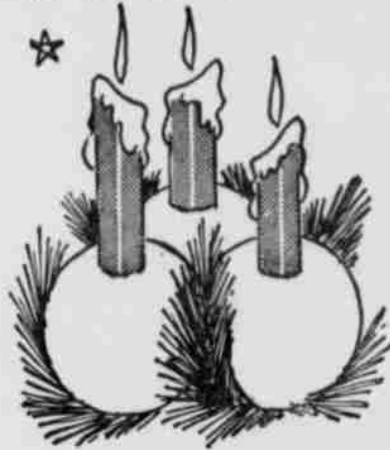

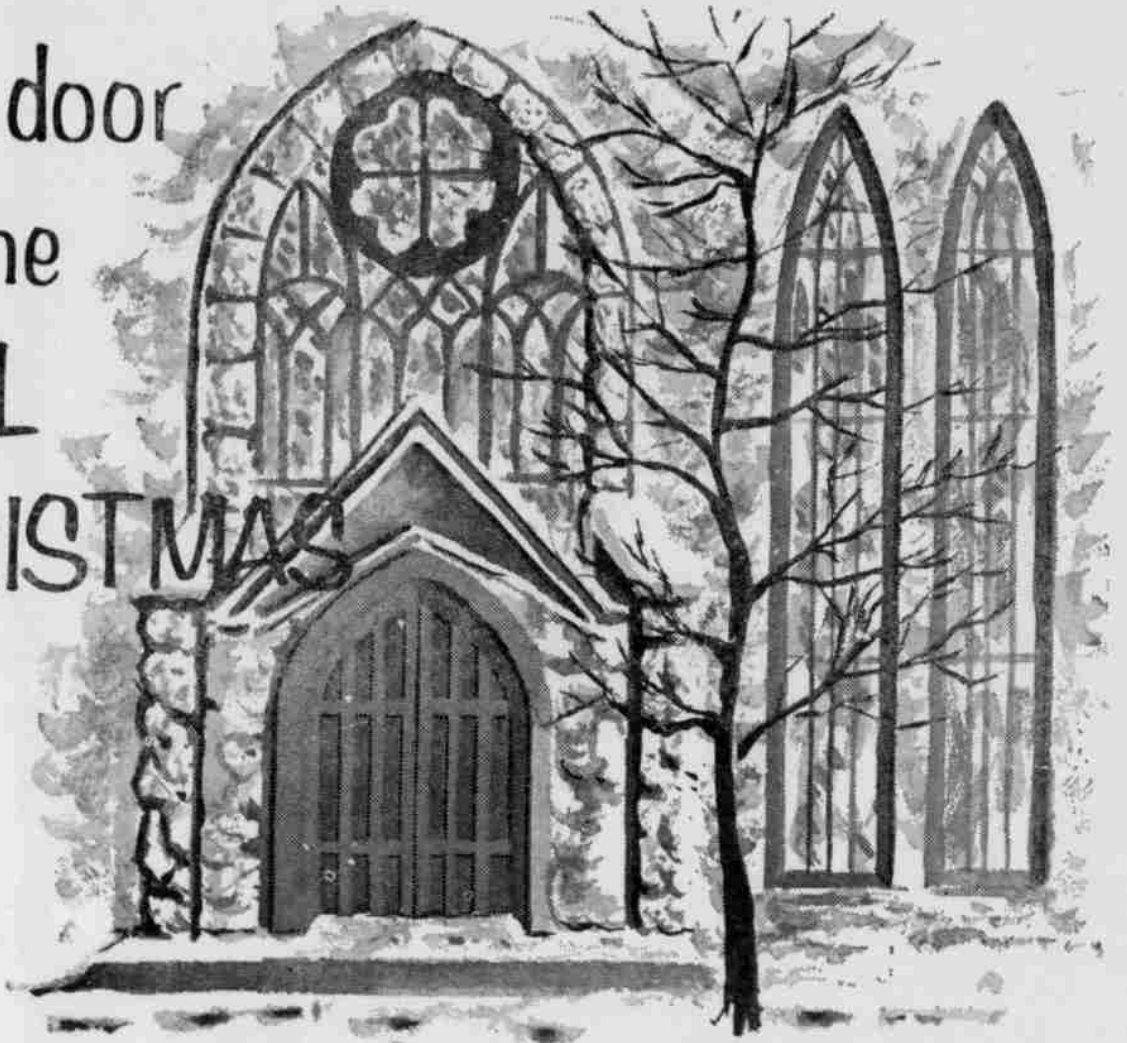
