Changes in Veteran's Loan Eligibility Requirements

Approval of the war veterans' bonding and loan amendment by Oregon voters November 8 means certain changes in veterans' eligibility for loans and sets deadline dates for applying. The Department of Veterans' Affairs says. The eligibility changes became effective Dec. 6, the date the election count was made official.

The deadline for World War II veterans to apply for state loans for homes and farms is January 31, 1960. The deadline for Korean veterans is January 31, 1958. There were no deadlines previously.

World War II veterans to be eligible for the loans must have served at least 90 days in the armed forces between September 15, 1940, and December 31, 1946. These dates used to be September 1, 1940, and September 2, 1945. They must have been Oregon residents at time of entry into service, or have resided in Oregon for at least two years between date of discharge and December 31, 1950.

Korean veterans must have served at least 90 days between June 25, 1950, and January 31, 1955. They must have been Oregon residents at time of entry into service, or for at least two years between discharge and December 31, 1960. There was no deadline previously for this post-war residence requirement for Korean veterans.
