 "JOHNNY OSAGE" by Janice Holt Giles: "Johnny Osage" comes by his name because of his close friendship with the Osage Indians. His story is told against the background of the old Osage homeland, the present state of Oklahoma, for by 1821 the frontier had moved westward and Johnny, a restless man who preferred the wilderness unspoiled by civilization, moved with it and became a partner in his brother-in-law's trading post. To such a man, the arrival of a group of missionaries to "improve" the Osages is far from welcome. And to Judith Lowell, the young teacher dedicated to educating Osage children according to the laws of God and the White Man, Johnny's admiration for Osage ways is shocking and inexplicable. The touching love story of Johnny and Judith is set against a dark and bloody background of raids and massacres in the bitter feud between Osages and Cherokees—a feud in which the U.S. government plays the role of uneasy arbiter.

**CHAMPIONSHIP MADRAS TEAM DOWNS MUSTANGS**

 Coach Ole Johnson's Madras cage squad kept their perfect record for the season as they downed the Heppner quintet both nights on the Madras maple. Friday night Heppner played the best game of the two but were still outclassed by the very strong Buff team as they racked up an 86 to 43 victory. Saturday evening the Mustangs got walloped by 51 points as they lost 84 to 33.  
 This was the last series for six Heppner boys who will graduate in May. They are Tom Green, Ron Gray, Larry Tibbles, Stuart Gribble, Dave Creswick and Dennis Dick.  
 Friday night both teams opened up the game fast with the Heppner team staying within one or two points until the middle of the period and the White Buffaloes settled down. The first period was the only quarter of the game that the Heppner team was able to control the Buffs at all. In the last three quarters, Madras was hitting from all parts of the floor with Joe Piedmont, Gregg Macy and Garry Moe leading the way. From the charity line Madras shot 65%.  
 Top scorer for the Heppner quintet and top for the game was Sonny Biddle with 18 and for Madras Garry Galbraith and Garry Moe led with 16 each.  
 Saturday night, Heppner was unable to do anything with the Madras team as they walked

away with their biggest victory of the season with a 51 point lead. Heppner went down to the league champs 84 to 33.  
 In the first half of play Madras got 42 points and the Heppner team only tallied for 15.  
 The second half of play was not much better for the Heppner team as Madras kept on rolling up the points.  
 The Mustang cage squad ended the 1960-61 season with 5 wins and 13 losses. They were tied for the cellar in the league.
