## From The County Agent's Office

A lot of interest is being shown in stocking farm ponds with fish this spring. Orders for 20,000 1 1/2 to 2-inch Kamloop trout have been left with Dr. L. D. Tibbles and this office. Prairie Springs Trout Farm at Dayville will deliver these fish within the next week or 10 days. If you want to get in on this first load which will be coming before April you can still leave your order with us.

For those who are interested in a farm fish pond but still have some unanswered questions a tour is scheduled for late April. We would be interested to hear from anyone who would like to have us visit their pond.

Because of the continuing occurrence of rabies in various animals thruout the state it would behoove us all to be somewhat observant as we go about our work and notice something dif-

ferent about our wild animals which might indicate the possibility of this disease. Rabid bats have been found in several counties and rabies infected foxes have been found in Lane county. Let us not be alarmed if we notice animals acting peculiarly; avoid them and report them to the county health officer, the veterinarian, or this office so that steps might be made to determine the infection.

Last Wednesday afternoon a tour of the South lone, Dry Fork, Gooseberry and Eightmile areas was made to determine the infestation of purple mustard in that area. The survey was conducted because of reports of heavy infestation of this hard-to-kill annual which is becoming more widespread as years go by. ## THIS IS YOUR HOSPITAL

One of the most frequent questions I am asked in "What's my blood type?"

Most of the time I can't answer this question. We do not routinely type your blood at the hospital for the reason that it is an added expense and is usually not necessary. The value in knowing your blood type is in the event someone else needs some blood. This knowledge saves the laboratory much time hunting for a donor of a particular type of blood. When you need a transfusion your blood is always typed even if you have been typed before. This is a safety precaution as the giving of the wrong type of blood can cause serious complications.

We are very fortunate in this community to have an excellent blood bank program. This program makes available to us quantities and types of blood that don't even exist in this area. Rare types of blood are available to us in this area through the Red Cross.

Another value of this program is that it provides a source of their neighbors who have infestation.

Burton Peck, Lexington area farmer, while visiting at the office one day last week commented on his seeding of LaHontan alfalfa on land which is sprinkled from a well recently drilled on his farm. Burton says that, "LaHontan is definitely the best alfalfa I have seen as it is early to come in the spring, is a fast grower, and makes quick recovery after being mowed. It is fine stemmed with many leaves making high quality hay." LaHontan is recommended for this area because of its resistance to wilt, spotted aphid, and some nematodes. It is high on the list of those recommended for our area.

## Hardman and Rhea Creek News

We routinely get a complete stock of fresh blood every two weeks and can get a fresh supply each week if we run short. At any time the need arises, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, we can get an emergency supply from any of the participating hospitals of the Yakima area.

One thing I want to clear up is about the charges for blood transfusions. First, neither the hospital nor the Red Cross charges for the blood. The hospital has several fees for the various services connected with giving.

1. Blood typing — varies from \$2.50 to \$10.00, according to the amount of work involved.

2. Crossmatching — two different methods, \$3.50 to \$5.00, this tests the bloods together in a test tube to see if they will mix in the patient's blood stream.

3. Blood processing fee — \$5.00. This fee is the same whether we or the Red Cross draws the blood. It includes blood bottle, needles, serological tests, storage, etc.

4. Blood administration fee — \$5.00. Labor and supplies for giving the blood.

I would like to point out that a private blood bank not only charges for the blood but also has these same service fees to add. At a private bank one pint of blood can cost you \$80.00!

Space does not permit me to go into detail on the many other advantages we obtain from this program such as fibrogen, frozen plasma, serum albumen, and other blood products that are available to us.

There is one essential thing that must be done to keep this program going. The blood we use must be replaced. ILL SEE YOU AT THE BLOOD DRAWING!
