Mum Culture Topic At Ione Garden Club

Mrs. Nicholson stated that to have this easiest of hardy plants grow at their best, one must give them good culture, a sunny location, a rich soil and do not let them suffer for want of moisture during the hot summer. They will not thrive in a hard baked and cracked soil. To have a sturdy and well branched plant it is advisable to pinch the terminal shoots once or twice during the season. Mrs. Nicholson demonstrated separating a clump of mums and gave the 18 members and two guests a plant for their own gardens.

The date of the annual plant sale was set for Saturday, April 29, at the Rebekah hall from 1 to 5 p. m. Cooked food, pie and coffee will also be available for sale. Choice dahlias, mums, early iris, cannas, Esther Reed daisies, and many other plants will be available to customers.
