NEW BOOKS IN THE HEPPNER LIBRARY

"THE HUNTER," by Tuviah Friedman: The author in his late teens was living in a medium-sized Polish city, when the Nazis launched World War II. Friedman and his family were herded into ghettos. He succeeded against incredible odds in escaping from the Nazi death center — crawling thru sewers, hiding in the woods, subsisting on raw potatoes for months on end. When the Soviet troops entered Poland young Friedman saw a chance to revenge himself on the Nazis and became a precocious and highly successful Nazi hunter. He later went to Vienna, where he joined a group of Palestinian Jews (a unit of the Haganah). It was at this time that Friedman first heard of Adolph Eichmann. His chief, Aaher Ben Nathan, ordered Friedman to find this murderer of some six million Jews. For fifteen years the dedicated and tireless hunter sought any clue that might disclose Eichmann's whereabouts. But as late as October 1959 he had failed to uncover him and was about ready to concede. Then a few weeks later the first clue came. The rest is history. "The Hunter" is the almost unbelievable yet authentic autobiography of a man who has not stopped his relentless search for Nazi criminals with the capture of Eichmann. Written with conviction and force, it is a sober and timely reminder that the world is not yet free of the diseased minds and the evil influence of the Nazis.

"THREE PASSPORTS TO ADVENTURE," by Hal and Halla Linker: Here are the adventures of the most widely known traveling family in America, encountered as they filmed exciting stories of life in 70 colorful settings and countries from Tahiti to Russia, for their television program. "Wonders of the World." This is the story of a happy, closeknit family of globe-trotters who have had much more than the average share of thrills and adventures in every corner of the world. There have been some tears with the laughter and hardships with the thrills, but Hal and Halla Linker tell their story with an irrefragable zest for adventure that will delight the entire family.

Junior Livestock Show at The Dalles

THE DALLES (Special) — For the fifteenth time Oregon boys and girls will gather in this Columbia River city June 4-7 for the annual Junior Livestock Show of the Oregon Wheat Growers League.

Early years of the show were recalled by General Manager Elmer Lierman as the operating board began whipping into action plans for conduct of the event.

This year's show again will be held at the commodious Seufert Buildings in Wasco County Park opposite The Dalles Dam, but for a number of years the event was held with the cooperation of Frank Wink and his sons at their auction yards, torn down to make way for a freeway.

These early shows were conducted by the Eastern Oregon Wheat League, predecessor of the present statewide organization. Showing of fat steers, hogs and lambs was by 4-H club showmen, but for some years now an FFA show has also been held, Lierman said. Now this event is of equal stature to the 4-H show.
