Mr. and Mrs. Frank Payne entertained a group of boys at their home Friday after school in honor of their son, Lee, on his tenth birthday.

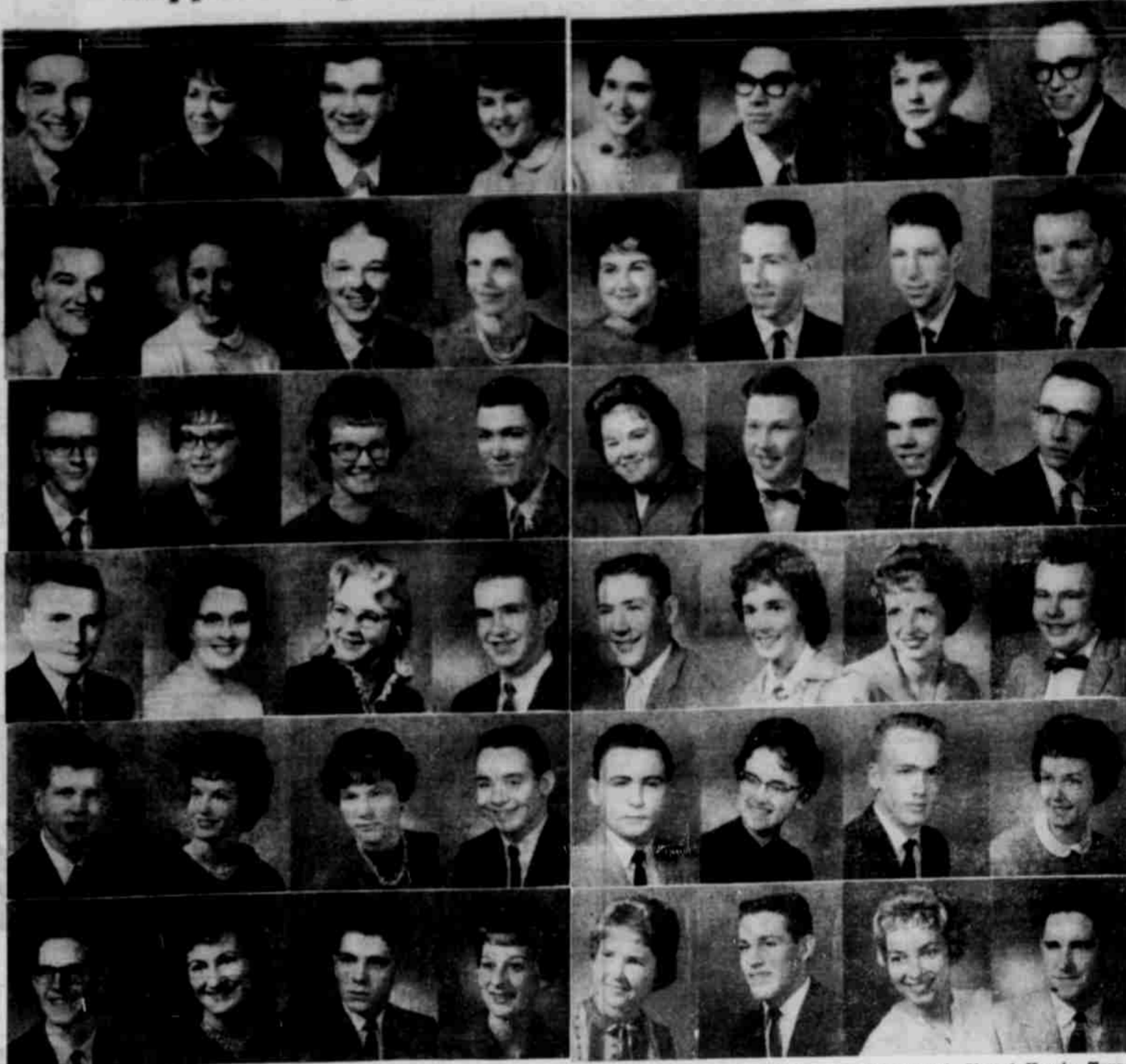
Using a very different idea to find his gift, Lee and the guests followed strings in and about the house and yard until discovering the new bicycle.
