He was the son of early pioneers of the area and was born March 23, 1892, near Cecil, which was named after his family. He was the son of Wilford and Elsie Cecil, and grandson of William Y. and Mary E. Cecil, who crossed the plains in a covered wagon in 1862 and settled on Willow Creek at the location now carrying their name.

In August, 1917, Mr. Cecil was married to Ruby Dennison, Spray. She died in 1958.

He was a veteran of World War I and served overseas in 1918.

Survivors are one daughter, Geraldine Gates, Spray; four sons, Vernon, of Kinzua, Percy, Darrell and Frank, Spray; one sister, Mrs. Norah Rasmus, Heppner; eight grandchildren.


