**'60 IFYE Student, Back in Scotland, Writes to Hosts**

In a letter to her host parents, Mr. and Mrs. Randall Martin, Miss Rhoda Campbell, the IFYE (International Farm Youth Exchange) student of 1960 to Morrow county wrote recently of news and good wishes from her home in Castle Douglas, Scotland.

Miss Campbell made her home with the Martins last summer, helping in the work of the 4-H summer camp, and making many friends here through her showing of slides and visiting with families and young people throughout the county.

This year exchange students will come to Morrow county from Luxembourg and Venezuela and living at the Fredrick Martin and Keith Rae homes. Since its start 10 years ago, more than 200 Oregon families have served as hosts to incoming exchangees.

Excerpts from Miss Campbell's letter dated June 16, follow:  
 "Dear Marie and Randall: Right now I'm cold—very cold! We had a real nice spring here but the last month or so has been dry and cold. Crops are not doing well because they badly need rain and heat. Today the dry spell broke and we now have rain but it is still cold. Let's hope we'll have some heat after the rain because it isn't very pleasant in school just now.

My headmaster is absent from school just now. I had three days on my own with the whole school and that was pretty tiring. Now a retired teacher is here as relief and things are better. We break up for summer vacation on June 30 and at the moment are busy working for school sports and a prize-giving concert and also making scrapbooks of animal pictures for children in hospitals.

"This week we have been shearing the yield of ewes and year-old lambs. This has meant quite a bit of baking for me at nights as there have been five men for teas both morning and afternoons all week. On top of that Mummie washed all curtains, cushion covers, blankets, etc., in one of the bedrooms at the week-end and left me to do the ironing. (Her mother teaches school where a younger sister attends, and is only home on week-ends, so Rhoda cooks during the week and is very busy).

"Tomorrow I go up to Edinburgh for the week-end. One of my girl friends is going off to India for two years and I've promised to go up and cater for her farewell party for 24 people on Saturday night. I'm making six kinds of savouries and sandwiches and three kinds of cakes so Friday night and Saturday will be busy.

"I am having the American girl IFYE to Scotland to stay the first week in July. She comes from North Carolina. She will arrive just before our shearing day so will get a good idea of the busiest time on a sheep ranch. We will probably have about 20 men to feed three cooked meals and two teas. Sometimes if they don't start clipping until late (because the wool is damp) we find ourselves feeding the men a cooked supper at 1 a. m.

"In the shearing season I hardly see my brother as he is away at dawn helping other farmers gather the sheep off the hill and not home till late at night.  
 After June 30, I'm finished teaching at this school. What I'll be doing I don't know, but right now I'm applying for a job and go for an interview on Monday. It is a lectureship in needlework with a manufacturing company. If I don't get it then I'll take a teaching part somewhere else.

"I'm still hoping to go out to New Zealand at the end of the year. If I can save enough money in my time out there I might come home on a boat calling at San Francisco and come up and see you.
