Oregon School Law requires all incoming first and ninth grade students to have a pre-school examination and to present the completed form at the beginning of the school year, according to public health nurse, Velma Glass.  
 The yellow "Oregon Pupil Medical Record" forms may be obtained in the offices of local physicians, the Morrow County Health department office, or the county school office.  
 Birth certificate application forms (required for first grade students) are available in the health department office also, or will be mailed upon request. The health department telephone number is 6-9611.  
 Parents are urged to have the examinations done as soon as possible so that any defects may be corrected before the child is ready for school. And, too, doctors' offices become swamped if everyone waits until the last day before school opens to ask for an appointment.
