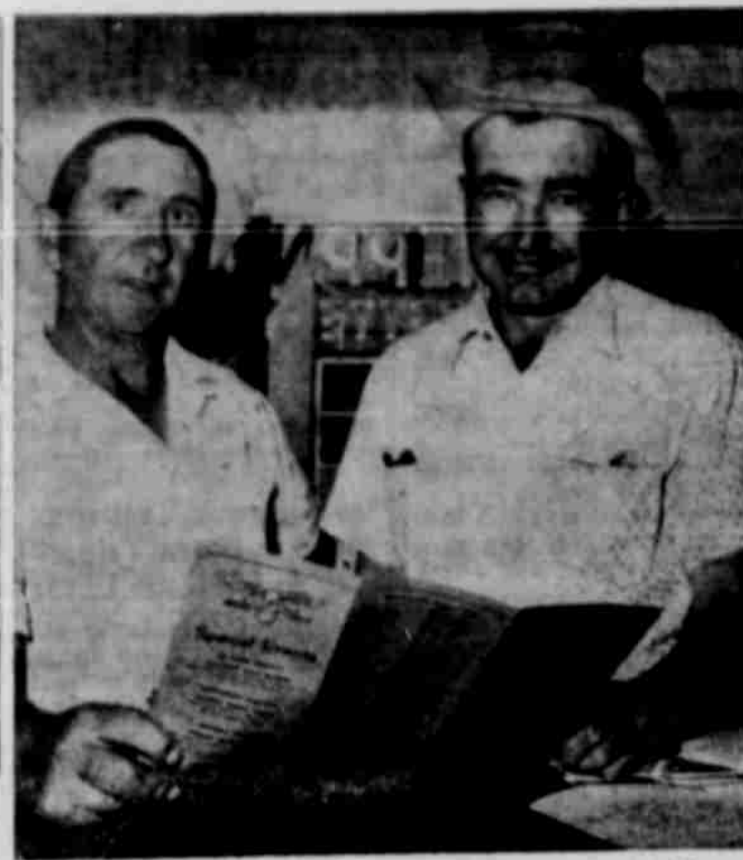

State Fair Offers Tickets to Show

Reservations for tickets to the Dennis Day stage show at the 1961 Oregon State Fair, Sept. 1-9, Salem, are now being taken at the fair office, Manager Howard Maple announced today.

The show is scheduled to be held in the new auditorium, and Maple said that contractors and suppliers have assured him the building will be completed by August 31.

There will be 6:15 and 8:15 performances each day of the fair, except Sunday when the matinee show will be at 2:30 p. m. Ticket prices are \$2.25, \$1.75 and \$1 for the second performance, and \$1.75 and \$1 for the matinee shows.

Tickets may also be reserved for the afternoon horse races and the matinee and evening performances of the rodeo. Maple added that advance box seat sales for the horse races have been the best in the history of the fair, as most of the boxes have already been reserved for the entire eight days of racing.

Box offices will open at Meier and Frank's of Salem and Stevens and Son of Salem and Portland on August 18. An additional box office will open at J. K. Gill's in Portland on August 28.
