Oregon State Fair To Start Friday On Nine-Day Run

Oregon's State Fair, nine days of fun and competition for every member of the family, kicks off its 96th annual run Friday, Sept. 1, at 10 a. m. with many new attractions added to the long list of traditional events that bring an estimated 300,000 persons to the 172-acre grounds yearly. Dennis Day, thoroughbred horse racing, a thrilling rodeo, The Thor-Able ballistic missile, John Strong's free circus and the fun-filled midway promise to keep the fairgoer busy the entire time he is on the grounds. For the serious-minded there will be the well-scrubbed cattle contesting for blue ribbons, rows and rows of tasty foods and painstakingly-done needlework, and the finest exhibits of Oregon's 4-H'ers and Future Farmers of America. Day, a veteran of almost every form of show business, headlines the night stage revue, which will have performances at 6:15 and 8:15 p. m. every day except Sept. 3 when performances are at 2:30 and 3:15 p. m. Appearing with Day will be Betty Johnson, a singer who appears regularly on the Jack Paar, and four other acts. Every day except Sunday the finest thoroughbred horses from the Northwest will go postward at 1 p. m. in quest of a record \$50,000 in purses. Ten races will be run daily, including at least one \$1,000 race. A new feature of the racing meet is the 2 1/16 mile Marathon Handicap on Saturday, Sept. 9. Christensen Bros. rodeo, a feature of the fair for many years, will return once again, and this time there will be a new format. Rodeo event will predominate, with many of the top cowhands from across the nation slated to appear, but three horse show events will be held at each performance. Cattlemen Seeking Secretary Applicants

Producer Referendum Backs Milk Price

Milk producers in area No. 8 recently voted down a referendum to wipe out the price established in June under the new producer milk stabilization program. This means the \$5.80 price per hundred weight of 4 percent milk established will continue in effect in Umatilla, Morrow, Grant, Gilliam, Sherman and Wheeler counties. The vote was 25 to 4. The price was challenged when Hager's Dairy, Heppner said they could not sell the milk for enough to pay for the price established by the milk stabilization administrator. Since that time Hager's has quit purchasing milk and is now acting as contracted haulers for area dairy men, who have organized to sell their own milk. They said they were unable to get the price set by the milk stabilization administrator and are selling to an out-of-state market for \$5.25 per hundred weight.
