**MOLDED FRUIT SALAD**  
2 pkgs. lemon Jello  
1 no. 2 can crushed pineapple (drained)  
1 cup small marshmallows  
3 bananas

Prepare Jello according to directions on box, add the fruits and marshmallows. Stir, then pour into 12" by 8" pan, let stand in refrigerator until set, make topping.

**TOPPING**  
1 cup pineapple juice  
1 rounded T flour  
1 egg  
1/2 cup white sugar  
1/2 pint whipping cream  
Cook sugar, flour, egg and juice over low heat until thick, stirring constantly. Cool, then add to whipped cream, spread on top of Jello, keep refrigerated until used.

Materials needed include:  
1 yard corduroy, velveteen or satin. (If you wish two pillows, 2 yards; no piecing with two yards)  
1/2 yard muslin or ticking  
2 large (1 1/2") buttons or poker chips (can be ordered from Edna Turner)  
1 pound shredded foam rubber

Strong string (linen)  
Yardstick  
Lead pencil, needle and thread
