4 to 6 chili tepines or 1 small red pepper.
4 t chill powder.
2 t whole cumin seed.
salt to taste.

Missionary To Japan To Speak Sunday

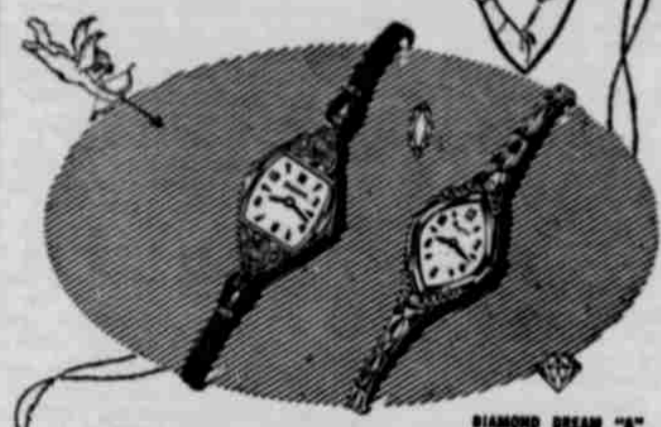
