## OSU Basketball Season Tickets Available

Oregon State will start accepting ticket applications for its 1961-62 basketball season on Tuesday, November 14, according to Business Manager Jim Barratt.

The Beavers will play 12 games in Corvallis and four in Portland (including three during the 1961 Far West Classic.) The remaining 10 games will be played away including the November 1-2 openers against the Uni-

versity of Montana at Missoula.

Home opener will be against the University of Washington at Corvallis on Saturday night, December 9. Other December games in Corvallis include Stanford on Saturday and Monday nights, December 16 and 18. Several thousands of ticket applications were mailed out to Beaver Club members, OSU alumni, and fans on the general public list by Monday, November 13.

The 1961 Far West Basketball Classic will be held in Portland on four evenings and two afternoons, December 27-28-29-30. Teams will include Michigan and Michigan State from the Big 10, California from the Big Five, Host Schools Oregon State and Oregon, and northwest independents Portland, Washington State and Idaho.

Corvallis season tickets will be priced at \$18 for the 12 games, with individual reserved seats for individual games raised from \$1.75 to \$2 this year. Far West Classic season tickets for the six doubleheaders will be \$10, all located in the choice lower balcony areas. Individual doubleheader prices are \$2.50 for evening doubleheaders and \$2 for the afternoon sessions.

In addition, the colorful Harlem Globetrotters will appear at Corvallis on Saturday night, January 6th, accompanied by Cab Calloway and a variety show.

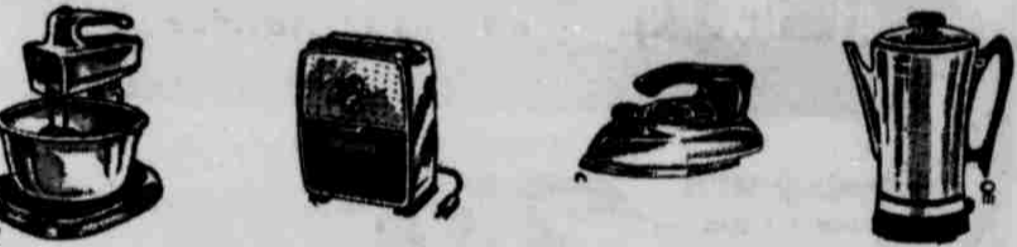
