**Madras Tops Mustangs  
In Pair on Buffs' Floor**

Madras' White Buffaloes, who benefitted by Heppner's double win over Burns here two weeks ago, edged near the division basketball title in the Greater Oregon high school league when they captured a pair from the Mustangs at Madras over the week-end.

The Buffs won Friday night, 49 to 43, and rolled to a 76-61 win Saturday night. In the first tilt of the two-game series, the Heppner five took only 33 shots from the floor making 12 good for a respectable .363 average. The Buffs' average was much poorer at .254 but they took 59 shots and connected on 15.

Heppner's cause in the opening game was hurt by the loss of sophomores Lee Padberg and Doug Dubuque, each of whom went out on five personals. In the low scoring game, Bob West of the Buffs was high man with 16 points, followed by teammate Phil Stevenson. Tops for Heppner was Captain Bruce Moyer with nine.

The Mustangs slipped behind at the start of the game and trailed 17-8 at the end of the first quarter. They went ahead in the second period to take a 24-21 halftime lead but faltered again to fall behind 31-32 at the end of the third. Madras came on with a rush in the final stanza.

Padberg, held to only four points Friday night, came back with a vengeance Saturday night, hitting 20 points for the Mustangs. Moyer made 12. Clements was high for the game with 18 followed by Galbraith of Madras with 17. Dubuque again went out on fouls while Madras lost Galbraith and K. Smith via the same route.

The Buffs held the lead all the way by maintaining quarter stop margins of 16-14, 31-26, and 49-44.

**Wayne Hams Gets Shrine Game Bid**

Wayne Hams, brilliant quarterback for the lone Cardinals' state runnerup B 8-man football team, has been chosen to play with the East squad in the Shrine All-Star football game to be held in Pendleton probably the third Saturday in August.

Daily papers Tuesday announced that Ron Crabtree, Cardinal end, had been selected for the squad. However, Ron is only a junior this year and will not be eligible for the Shrine contest until he has completed his senior year in high school. He compiled an outstanding record, however, and his selection, though in error, was nevertheless a compliment to his ability.

Hams, through some error, was not included in the original list, according to Principal Darrel Reish of lone high school. However, when Coach Glenn Biehl called Shrine game officials after announcement was made public, he learned that Hams had received among the highest number of votes of any player on the squad by coaches and would be included on the squad.

The Cardinal quarterback starred in virtually every game he played, making long runs and dead-eye passes to bowl over the opposition. The team went through the regular season undefeated and then knocked over Mt. Vernon and Herford in succession in state playoffs before losing to Sisters in the B 8-man finals.

The Shrine game includes both B and A-2 players. Only other selection from this area is Eddie Banker, Stanfield back.
