Peterson Talk Concluded

(This is the conclusion of the talk given by Judge Oscar Peterson at the National Association of County Officers held in Phoenix, Ariz.)

To be eligible for the Federal grant we had to make an inter-agency agreement between the ports and the counties and apply for the grant that a state agency is authorized to do planning for the state and major sectors of the state. This we arranged to do and are now known as the Mid-Columbia Planning Council, with myself as president, Judge D. R. (Sam) Cook of Umatilla county as vice-president, and Judge Harris Higgin's of Hood River county as secretary-treasurer. We were incorporated and became known as the Mid-Columbia Planning Council. The need for some kind of land use planning was quite apparent, not only for the north Morrow county but adjacent counties as well. In our efforts to organize the regional agency it became increasingly apparent that we contact reliable consultants, who might look at the area from an outside point of view. A nationwide consulting firm was decided upon. Some delay was encountered in securing funds under the 701 project. Additional state legislation was needed. This was taken care of in the 1961 session of our state legislature. Then just last week, the Planning grant from the Housing and Home Finance Agency of funds for the work in the Mid-Columbia area was approved. We are now eligible for federal grant funds at the rate of 2 to 1 for monies expended in this program. And the firm, Ebasco Services, Inc. retained as consultants. We are also making arrangements to hire an executive secretary who will be expected to do a portion of the work in collecting existing data for the consulting firm. He will also act as the contact man for industries and firms looking this way for new location sites. Although space age industries are looking

Services February 3 For Gerald Harrison

MONUMENT—Services for Gerald Newton Harrison, 70, were held at Monument Community church Saturday, February 3, with Rev. Kenneth Thomas officiating.

Mr. Harrison died January 30, at the Pendleton hospital. He was born in Aberdeen, Wn., June 8, 1891, the son of Isaac N. and Clara E. Harrison, who homesteaded at Top near Monument in 1903.

He was a U. S. Army Veteran of the Mexican border incident of 1916 and of World War I. He served in the army from 1914 to 1918.

He is survived by a sister, Hella Omaha of Gresham; three brothers, Zephyl of Hermiston, Basil of Redmond and F. M. of Kinzua.

Concluding services were in the Monument cemetery, with Burns Mortuary of Pendleton in charge of arrangements.

Year End Nears For 1961 Wool Incentive Payment

The 1961 wool program incentive payments, to be made this summer, will cover only wool and unshorn lambs which are marketed before March 31, David McLeod, office manager for the agricultural stabilization and conservation service, reminded growers today. That is the closing date for the 1961 program, which extends from April 1, 1961 to March 31, 1962. Growers will have 30 days after the closing date in which to file their applications for the payments. Payments to the producers for the 1961 marketing year will follow the same methods used in previous years. Shorn wool payments will be equal to a percentage of each producer's cash returns from wool sales. The percentage—to be announced later—will be that required to raise the national average price received by all producers for shorn wool during the marketing year up to the incentive price of 62 cents per pound. Lamb payments will be made to each producer who sells lambs

that have never been shorn. The payment will be at a rate per hundredweight of live animals marketed to compensate for the wool on them on a basis comparable to the national average incentive payment per pound of shorn wool.

Mr. McLeod emphasized the importance of keeping adequate records on sales, which must support the information on payment applications. Thus producer's sales records for shorn wool should show name and address of buyer, date of sale, name and address of producer, net weight of wool sold, and net proceeds to producer after normal marketing deductions.
