Cook noodles in salted water until tender. Place layer of noodles in casserole dish, add 1/2 can of tuna and 1 egg, chopped. Add another layer of noodles, put in rest of tuna and other egg, chopped up. Add remaining noodles and top with one can of the soup. Bake in oven at 350 degrees for 20 minutes.
