Luella Dunning Guest Speaker

Miss Luella Marguerite Dunning, a gifted teacher and, until a few months ago, dean of the girls' division of Aleppo College in Syria, will speak at the lone Community church on March 18, at the 11:00 o'clock worship service.

Miss Dunning gave up a teaching post in the United States in 1944 to go to the near east under the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions, now part of the United Church Board for World Ministries.

For three years she taught at Izmir, Turkey, and Aleppo, then returned to this country to resume a teaching career which, over the years, included service in the public schools of Wisconsin, Rhode Island and Massachusetts.

She was teaching at Andover, Mass., when she decided to retire early and go back to the girls' division of Aleppo College. From 1955 to 1961 she directed its affairs with conspicuous success.

When she left the school in February, 1961, the board under which she served noted that scholarships had been established in her honor, and added: "Even this brief term of service in the near east has left many students in her debt."
