An auto damage action, scheduled to be heard before a jury in Morrow County circuit court Thursday, April 5, was apparently settled out of court and did not come to trial, Mrs. Sadie Parrish, county clerk, said. Betty Hovis was plaintiff in the action that sought damages totaling \$21,164.25 as a result of an accident that called the life of her former husband, Gerald Dale Gray, on February 14, 1959. Defendant was Larry Duane Eades.
