ALL-NUMBER CALLING IS COMING to HEPPNER, IONE and LEXINGTON

Meet Mr. Digit... He's Vice President in Charge of Numbers at Pacific Northwest Bell. And he's announcing that telephone customers in Heppner, Ione and Lexington will start using All-Number Calling effective 11 p.m. on April 28.

"New look" numbers have already been mailed to telephone users in these communities. The seven-digit numbers are also listed in the new 1962 telephone books now being delivered to homes and businesses.

What is All-Number Calling? It's simple. Instead of the 3, 4 or 5 digit telephone number you had up to now,

you will have a full 7-digit number. For example, in Heppner instead of 6-5580, your new number will be 676-5580. That's right, you now have a 7-digit telephone number. There are good reasons for switching to the new plan. Mainly it's the only way to make enough dialing combinations to cover our fast-growing population. Numerals provide about 50 per cent more prefix combinations than letters. And it cuts down confusion between "look alikes" like the letter "O" and the number Zero, or the letter "I" and the number One.

Be sure the "new look" number mailed to you has been placed on the phones in your home or business. If you have difficulty or need additional number stickers, just call Repair Service.

Make sure your out-of-town callers know about your new seven-digit number. Print it on your stationery and tell your friends, relatives and business associates.

And when you list your number or give it to out-of-staters, please remember to include Oregon's Area Code - 503. It's shown on your new number sticker. You'll be helping us help you to the best in telephone service.
