**Oatmeal Cake**  
Pour 1 1/2 cups boiling water over 1 cup quick cooking oatmeal and 1/2 pound butter or margarine, let stand for 20 minutes and add:  
1 cup white sugar  
1 cup brown sugar  
1/2 cup, beaten  
1/2 cup raisins (soaked and drained)

sift together and add:  
1 1/2 cups flour  
1 t soda  
1 t cinnamon  
1/2 t baking powder  
Beat mixture until smooth, bake in 8x12 loaf pan or 2 layer cake pans, 350 degrees, 35 minutes.

**Cake Topping**  
1 cup sugar  
1 cup shredded coconut  
1/4 pound butter or margarine  
1 egg  
1/4 cup evaporated milk  
1 t vanilla  
1/2 cup chopped nut meats  
Mix all ingredients together except vanilla and nut meats, and bring to a boil, stirring constantly, then cook slowly about 3 or 4 minutes. Add vanilla and nuts and spread over warm cake, serve cake warm or cold.
