Dear Editor:

I would like to inform the people of Morrow county that my husband was discharged from the county payroll last Friday, July 6, after working there for 14 years. They say his work was satisfactory, but they had to cut down on the crew because they did not have enough money to operate. I think there are only one or two men on there who have been there longer than my husband. Evidently seniority means nothing. The county has no retirement plan or unemployment, so this leaves him trying to find a year round job at an age when he should be almost retiring. He's not old enough for social security but at an age when it's hard for a man to find work.

They say they have no complaints from the people on his work. He's tried to do good work, as he takes pride in a job well done. Sometimes he's been bawled out for staying on a job longer than anticipated, because he hated to leave without it being finished right. Sometimes he put in overtime work without any pay. Sometimes when working with a crew, he has been accused of being cranky by a fellow worker for wanting something done as he seen it should be done. I wish to say that although he may have been cranky sometimes, he never had any more trouble with the crew than the average man would. He has never had anything but kind words for all when speaking of them, although some tales have floated around otherwise.

A personal grudge, to my way of thinking, should not be brought into a man's work, but that is what has happened. Why some of the things were told I'll never understand. One thing was that my husband was trying to get the foreman's job which evidently must be the man's imagination. If this kind of thing can go on, where is there any fairness in this world? No doubt there will be other stories told why he was let go, but I hope the people will find out the truth before believing them. My husband has lived here all his life and I most of mine. We've always tried to do the right thing.
