4-H Rifle Clubs To Hold County Matches Aug. 19

Four-H rifle club members will hold their second annual county-wide 4-H rifle match Sunday afternoon, August 19, according to Joe Hay, county agent. The match will get underway at 1:00 p.m. and will be held at the lone rifle range.

The 4-H rifle range at Ione is located about 1 mile north of Ione up Rietmann Grade on the Delbert Emert ranch. A small sign on the right side of the road shows the way to the range.

The 4-H rifle match holds considerable significance for boys and girls in the intermediate 12 to 14, and senior 15 and over age groups. The top three scorers from each of these divisions will be eligible to compete as a team in the state 4-H rifle match which is held at the State Fair in September.

The 4-H rifle program stresses safety in handling of rifles as well as good sportsmanship and respect of private property and natural resources. The rifle program is also a means of obtaining an Oregon State Game Commission Hunter Safety Certificate which is now required for all juvenile hunters.

"Plenty of parking space is available at the range and the public is invited," Hay said.

Rural Housing Loans Available To Non-Farmers

Rural Housing loans are now available to owners of non-farm tracts in rural areas and in rural communities of not more than 2,500 population. Previously, only farm families were eligible for this type of credit.

Rural Housing loans will not only help families obtain better homes but will put more carpenters, plumbers, and electricians to work, and will increase the sales in lumber yards and building firms.

Housing loans are made for the construction, repair, and remodeling of dwellings and essential farm buildings and to provide water for farmstead and household use.

In addition to major construction, funds are available to modernize homes—add bathrooms, central heating, modern kitchens and other home improvements, as well as to enlarge and remodel farm service buildings and put in related facilities such as paved feedlots, yard fences, and driveways.

The interest rate is 4 percent on the unpaid balance of the loan. Repayment may be up to 33 years.

The proposed housing must be adequate to meet the family's needs yet modest in size and design.

To be eligible an applicant must own a farm or a housing site in a rural area; be without decent, safe and sanitary housing; and be unable to obtain the needed credit from other sources. He must also have sufficient income to meet payments on existing debts, meet other expenses, and make payments on the proposed loan.

Other loans available including operating, farm ownership, and soil and water.

Information may be secured at the FHA office in Pendleton located at 105 S. E. Byers Avenue. The office day is each Monday.
