## In 8th Year Here

One of the highlights of the Morrow county rodeo is the Northwest Amateur Saddle Bronc riding championship contest, which will be in its eighth year here at the 1962 event.

Held at Pendleton for some 30 years as a feature of the Round-up, the championship was the first held at Heppner in 1955 and has been on the annual program since that time. History of the event dates back to 1925 at Pendleton and winners throughout the years compose a list of names very well known in the rodeo circuit.

Cherished trophy of the event is a fine handmade saddle from Hamley and Company of Pendle-ton. Saddle for this year's winis now on display at Gillian

and Bisbee Hardware. Norman Goree was the 1955 winner, followed by Bud Godby in 1956. Gib Gregg won the title in 1957, and Manny Squakin took the honors in 1958.


