40 New Leaders Needed For 4-H Work This Year

At least 40 new volunteer 4-H club leaders will be needed in the 1962-63 Morrow county for the 1962-63 club year, according to Joe Hay,

county agent. The new leaders will be needed to increase the 4-H club program and to take care of the normal yearly turnover of 4-H leaders.

A goal of 85 additional club members has been set for the 4-H club program in Morrow county for the coming year, Hay indicated. If this goal is to be reached more leaders are needed. A training meeting for new and prospective 4-H leaders will be held Thursday evening, September 27, at the fair annex building in Heppner. This meeting will be from 8:00 to 10:00 p.m. If you are interested in leading a 4-H club, you are invited to come to this meeting and find out more about what a 4-H club is, how it functions and how to organize a club. "You are not obligated to lead a 4-H club if you attend this training meeting," Hay said. "We would like for you to know more about the 4-H program and hope that you will become interested in being a 4-H leader."

"Many project areas are available for you to choose from," continues Hay. "If you are interested in working with boys and girls as a 4-H club leader. The following is a list of projects which are available."

Electricity, woodworking, entomology, field crops, forestry, horticulture, livestock, (including beef, dairy, sheep, swine, rabbits, horses, dogs and dairy goats), marketing, wildlife (including fishing, gun safety, archery), child development, rock-hounding, clothing for boys, square dancing, clothing for girls, food preparation, food preservation, home improvements, knitting, photography, automotive, tractor, health and junior leadership.

Morrow county has not had clubs in many of these areas in the past. Many people have had the impression that 4-H club work was only for country boys and girls. Many of the projects on the list are for town boys and girls as well.

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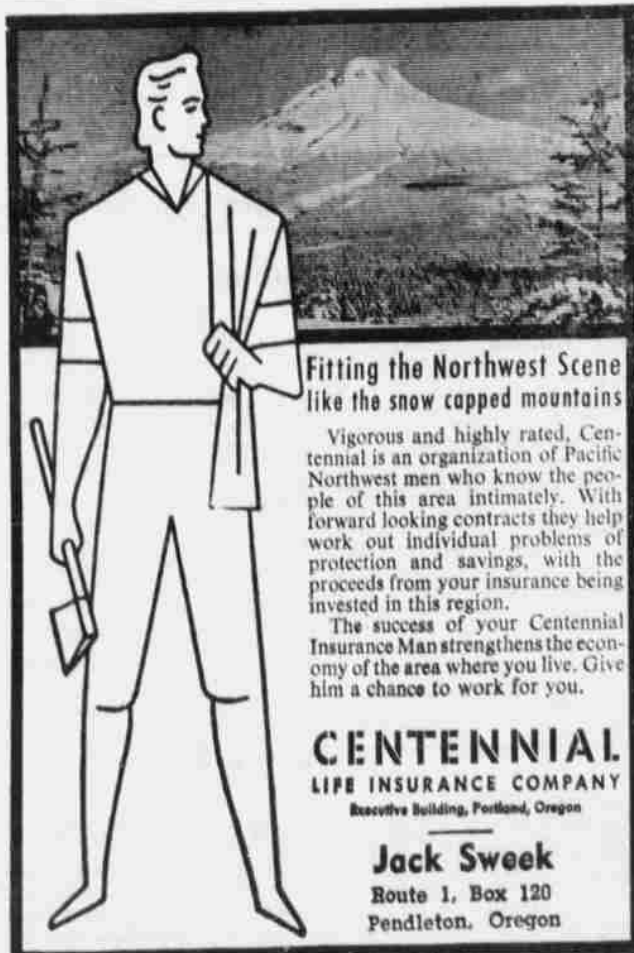
