Dr. James H. Jensen, university president, reminded the recipients that "the United States is unique in the world because a higher education is available to anyone who wants to work for it."

J. W. Jarvis, supervisor of the UP agricultural department, said, "The Union Pacific started the scholarship program in 1921 because it realized it should help build leaders in agriculture, industry and education."

Every year the UP offers a \$200 scholarship to one vocational agriculture student and one 4-H member in 198 counties.

Jarvis, who was the first vocational agriculture student to receive a UP scholarship as a youth at Ontario, said 8745 scholarships have been granted by UP, 788 in Oregon.
