

Morrow to Get Federal Aid Money

Allocation of some \$3,746,000 for county road construction was made today by the Oregon State Highway Commission. The funds, which go to all 36 counties in the state, include \$2,247,331 in federal money, with the remain-der split between county and state matching monies.

Morrow county will receive \$34,642. Gilliam county will receive \$25,608, Grant county, \$31,565, Umatilla county \$75,278 and Wheeler county \$22,478.
