IRRIGON—Chester Wilson was elected mayor of Irrigon at the January council meeting. Council members present were: Mrs. Louis Shade, Mrs. Albert Partlow, Mrs. Ernest Jorgenson, who was sworn in at the January meeting, Donald Adams and Chester Wilson, Mrs. Leon Bentley, secretary of the Planning Commission, and Perry Pummel, city marshal, also attended the meeting.

The Planning Commission had previously requested Mayor Adams to appoint an Irrigon Park Board, and the board members appointed by Adams and approved by the council are as follows: Jim Keith, chairman; Mrs. Vestie Elgin, secretary; Mrs. Paul Slaughter, Orville Buchanan, Lloyd Cooley, Lee Gustafson and Lee LeBlanc.
