**RICE CASSEROLE**  
1/2 cup rice  
1 cup boiling water  
1 t salt  
1/2 pound lean pork (pork steak)  
1/2 pound veal  
2 T fat  
1 1/2 cup diced celery  
1 1/2 cup diced onion  
1/2 cup green pepper  
1/4 cup pimento  
1 can mushroom soup  
2 T soya sauce  
Place rice in greased 2 quart casserole, add boiling water and salt, let stand. Slowly brown meat in hot fat, add celery, onion, green pepper, stir until transparent. Pour into rice mixture, with soup, pimento, soya sauce, and mix. Bake in moderate oven 350 degrees, 1 hour 15 minutes.
