To Start Monday Smoking Clinic

A "Five-day Plan" to quit smoking will be held in the American Legion hall in Heppner beginning Monday night, March 25, at 7:30. Elder Elwood Boyd, pastor of the Seventh-day Adventist church, and Doctors Harold S. Huber and C. M. Wagner will present the group therapy clinic to everyone interested.

"Men and women who formed the habit of smoking 20 years ago, or even 10 years ago did not have the facts that are available now. Had it been, there would no doubt be fewer smokers today and fewer deaths from lung cancer," said Mr. Boyd.

While all other deaths from cancer have closely followed the pattern of all deaths in general, that of deaths from cancer of the lung has sky rocketed, he said. In 1930 there were 2,500 lung cancer deaths. This shot up to 11,000 in 1945. This year the American Cancer society place the figure at an estimated 41,000 people.

"What are the chances of survival when cancer of the lung is detected? Statistics offer little hope, for only about 1 in 20 is cured today," Mr. Boyd suggests that wives come with their husbands for correct manner of food preparation will be included in the overall plan to conquer smoking completely in only 5 days.
