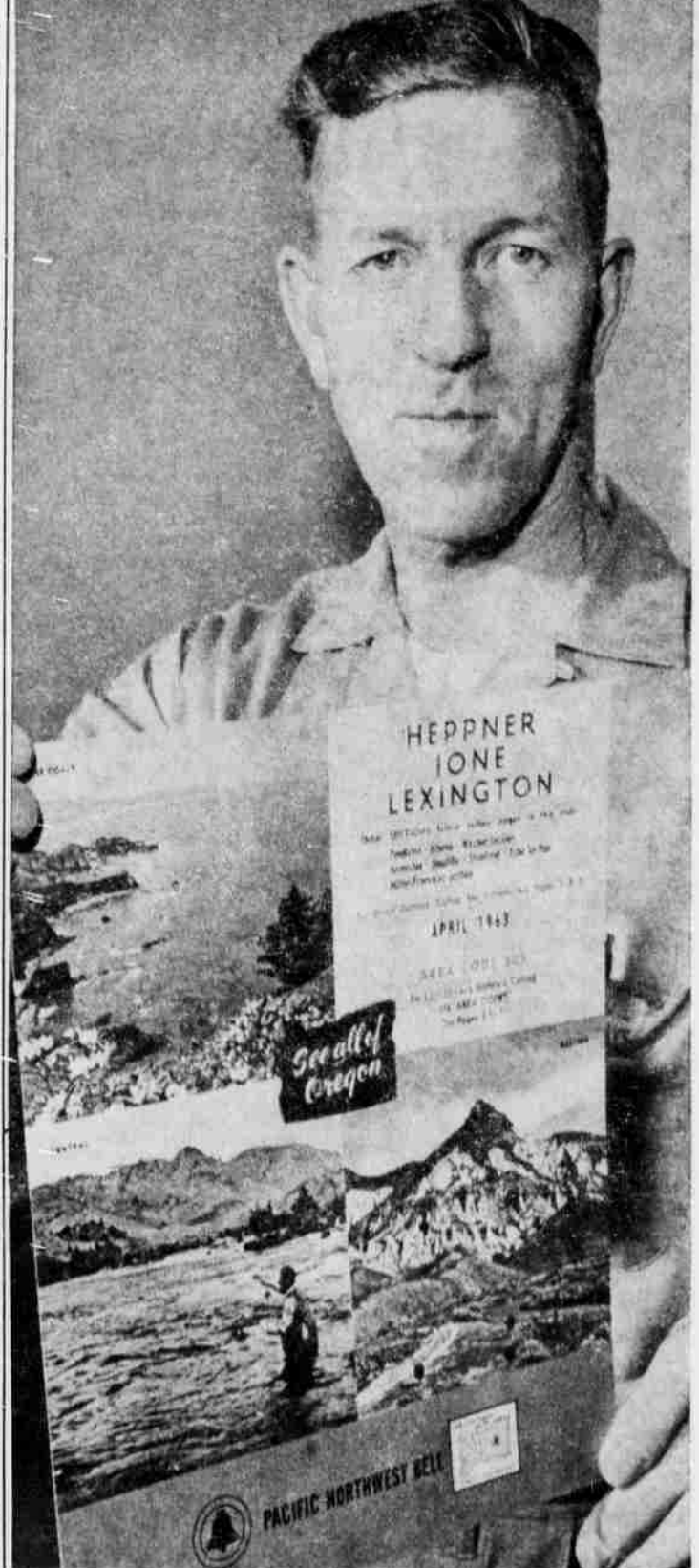

New Phone Books To be Distributed

The 1963 Heppner telephone directory will start arriving at homes and businesses here Wednesday, April 10, according to Dale Slusher, local manager for Pacific Northwest Bell.

The cover features full color scenes of Western, Central and Eastern Oregon. The vista from Otter Crest on the coast, a fisherman on the Deschutes and the colorful John Day canyon com-

bine to urge everyone to "See all of Oregon."

Expanded area code information for long distance calling will be found in the introductory pages of the new directory. Handbooks with area codes for hundreds of U. S. and Canadian communities are available at the business office. New Blue Books for personal telephone number lists are also available for the asking. Both are free of charge.

Slusher urged everyone to jot police, fire and other emergency service numbers in the spaces provided inside the front cover of the phone book. Small pictures of appropriate emergency vehicles have been printed next to these spaces to aid quick identification.

The post office is delivering the phone books again this year, and expects to complete the job by Saturday (April 13).

Some 27,000 copies were printed for the Umatilla and Morrow county exchanges listed in the book.

Nearly 18,500 will be distributed to those exchanges next week. Athena, Weston and Pendleton customers will receive some 9400 copies; Milton-Free-water, 2800; Hermiston, Echo, Stanfield and Umatilla, 4900; and the Heppner, Ione and Lexington exchanges, 1400.

Another 1300 will go to other points in Oregon and throughout the nation. The remaining copies will be used during the year for new customers and for replacement of worn out books.
