Perhaps there is much justification in the criticism that too many legislators are spending their time carping at the activities of others—party fight against party—and the inescapable knowledge that too many take advantage of free postage, secretarial help and all the other things a solon falls heir to. Of course, these advantages make it easier to mow down those in disfavor.

I enjoyed immensely your last issue. Letters and news stories pertaining to Boardman were especially appreciated.

It has been beyond me to understand the criticism directed at the Boardman picture. It would appear to me that getting the Boardman project would rank (not so striking, of course) with our great land purchases from France and the purchase of Alaska from Russia.

It is not, in my judgement, too important that Boeing develop projects at the site. The thing that is vital is that we now have the location—one of the prime industrial sites in the west.

Because of the very nature of the location it will probably remain one of the few smog free areas. Transportation facilities are a tremendous advantage.

**Annie Carter Lefler Dies in California**

Annie Carter Lefler died in San Francisco, Calif., April 16, at the age of 89 and was buried at Cypress Lawn cemetery, in that city on April 19.

Mrs. Lefler will be remembered by friends here and in Grant county as Annie Carter. She was born in Bradford, England, December 10, 1874 as Annie Holt and came to America when a small child, to Salt Lake City, Utah, where she lived until after her marriage to John Carter, and the birth of their first child. The small family then moved to Oregon settling near Long Creek and Monument where four more children were born.

Mrs. Carter married Jack Lefler in 1918 and was residing in Heppner when it so nearly burned, on July 4, 1918. She later moved to Portland and then, in 1949 to San Francisco, where she was residing with her son, Melvin, at the time of her death.

She leaves one son, Melvin Carter and one daughter, Jessie Smith, Heppner; eight grandchildren, 18 great-grandchildren and five great-great-grandchildren.

Mrs. Smith went from here for the memorial service with her son, James Smith, of Pendleton.

**UMATILLA-MORROW COUNTIES BLUE MOUNTAIN AREA EDUCATION DISTRICT**

Notice is hereby given that a regular election has been called by the District School Board of the Blue Mountain Area Education District of Umatilla-Morrow Counties, Oregon, the said election to be held in the said District and State on the 6th day of May between the hours of 2:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. in the following voting places: Heppner Elementary School, Irigon Elementary School, Riverside High School, Ione High School, Lexington Elementary School, Ruggs polling place, and Pine City School all being in Morrow County; and Umatilla Elementary

School, Hermiston Junior High School, Stanfield West Elementary School, Echo Elementary School, Helix Elementary School, Adams Elementary School, Athena Elementary School, Weston Elementary School, McLoughlin Union High School, Umapine Elementary School, Ukiah Elementary School, Pilot Rock Elementary School, Washington School, Hawthorne School, Lincoln School, Sherwood Heights, Rieth School all being in Umatilla County.

At this time there will be submitted to the legal voters of the Area Education District the question of establishing a tax levy for the fiscal year 1963-1964 for the sum of \$147,683.25 as permitted by Section 11 Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, which said period commences on July 1, 1963 and ends on June 30, 1964, and said levy shall be placed upon the 1963-64 Assessment Roll and said taxes will be due and payable on November 15, 1963, February 15, 1964, May 15, 1964, and August 15, 1964.

The reasons for establishing this tax levy are for payment of teachers and administrators' salaries, supplies and equipment for the classrooms, operation costs of the school plant and amounts required for the payment of teacher retirement obligations, all as required by the Laws of the State of Oregon. The voice shall be by ballot, upon which shall be marked "Tax Levy" ( ) and the word "Yes" and "Tax Levy" and the word "No" and the voter shall place a cross (with an x in it) between the word "Tax Levy" and the word "Yes" or between the word "Tax Levy" and the word "No" whichever indicates his choice.

AT THIS ELECTION WE WILL ALSO VOTE TO ELECT ONE DIRECTOR FOR A 5 YEAR TERM.

Voters shall vote in the precinct listed which closest approximates their regular School District or Union High District Voting Poll.

**Final Report Given Seal Sale**

Final report of the Morrow County TB and Health Association Christmas Seal campaign shows a total collection of \$1,224.10, as of March 31, according to Mrs. Herman Stroeber, county campaign chairman.

Of this amount, \$899.71 will be used for x-rays, skin patch tests and further work of the health association. The total compares with \$1253.70 received last year. The chairman reports there were 1,173 letters mailed to homes in the county.

Total receipts by towns are as follows: Heppner, \$614.50; Ione, \$271.00; Lexington, \$130.10; Boardman, \$105.50, and Irigon, \$103.00.

Mrs. Stroeber expresses appreciation to all community chairmen for their fine help and to county residents for support of the campaign and their use of the seals.
