Mrs. Dallas McDaniel and children Melvin and Iva Lou made a business trip to Pendleton on Monday.

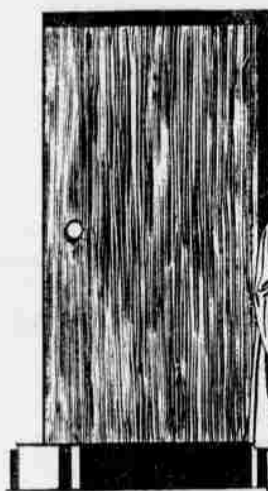

## Students to Receive Scholarship Awards

Jacquelyn L. Brindle and Leola Anne Joynes, both members of this year's graduating class at Heppner High school, have recently been announced as recipients of scholarships for the coming fall term at Eastern Oregon College, La Grande.

Also named for scholarship aid is Dennis D. Doherty, now attending the University of Oregon. He is one of 107 students enrolled there and granted aid by the State Scholarship Com-

mission for the next academic year.

There have been 1558 Oregon students awarded one of three kinds of scholarships, as announced by the commission in Salem on May 8. Approximately 50% of these students will be 1963 graduates and the remaining are already enrolled in institutions of the Oregon State System of Higher Education.
