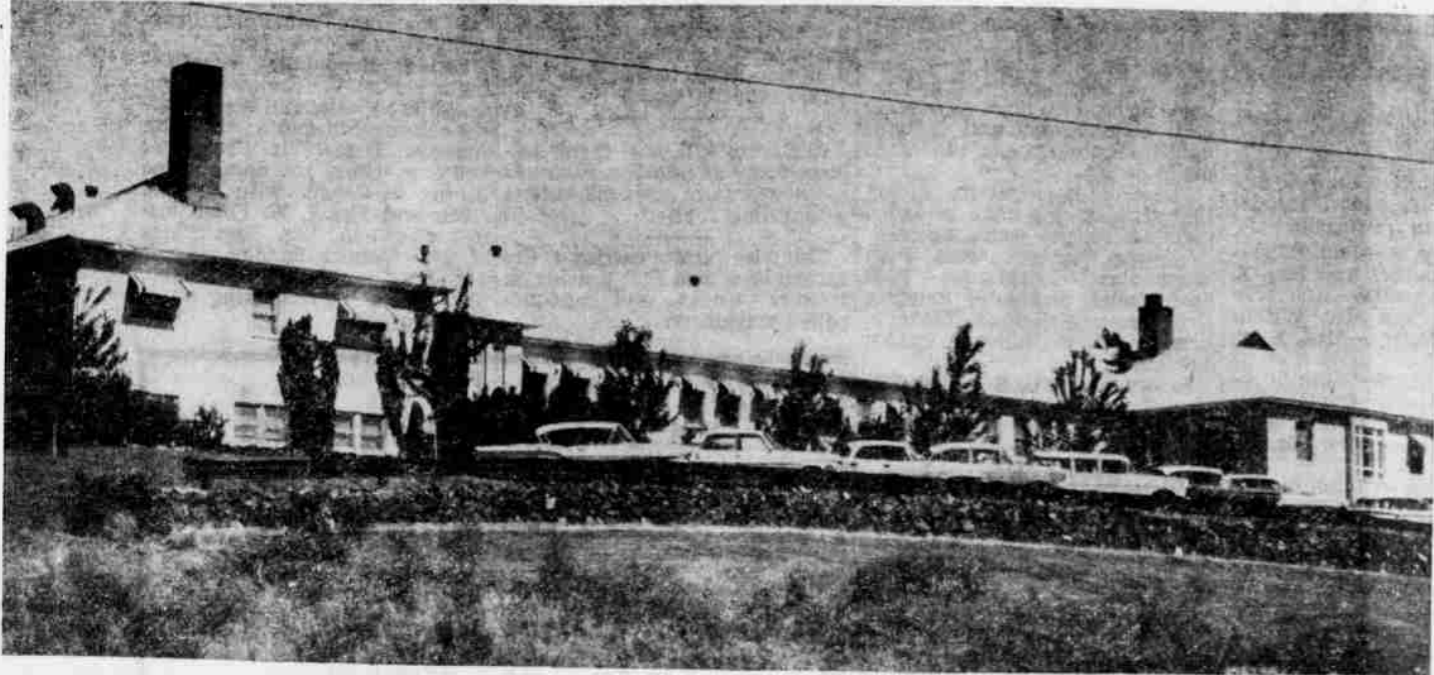

THERE'S AN EXCELLENT HOSPITAL . . .



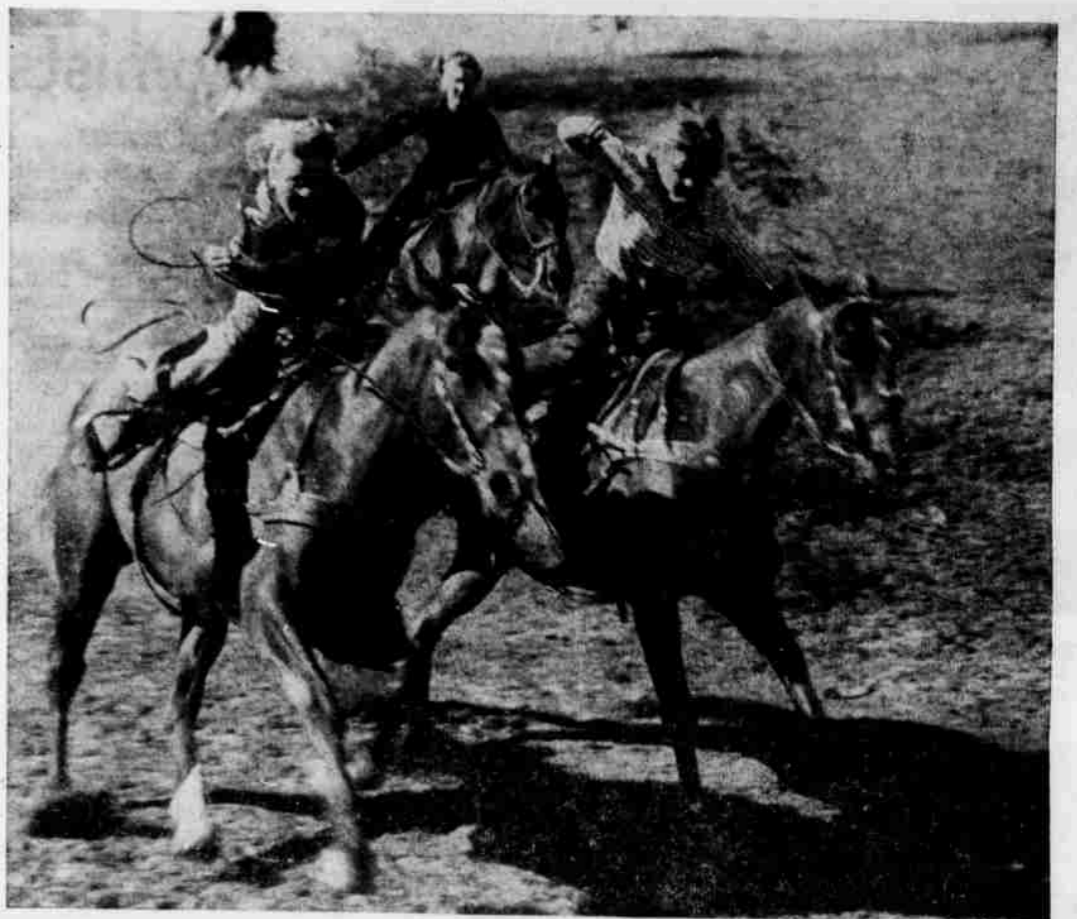

. . . AND AN OUTSTANDING LIBRARY-MUSEUM



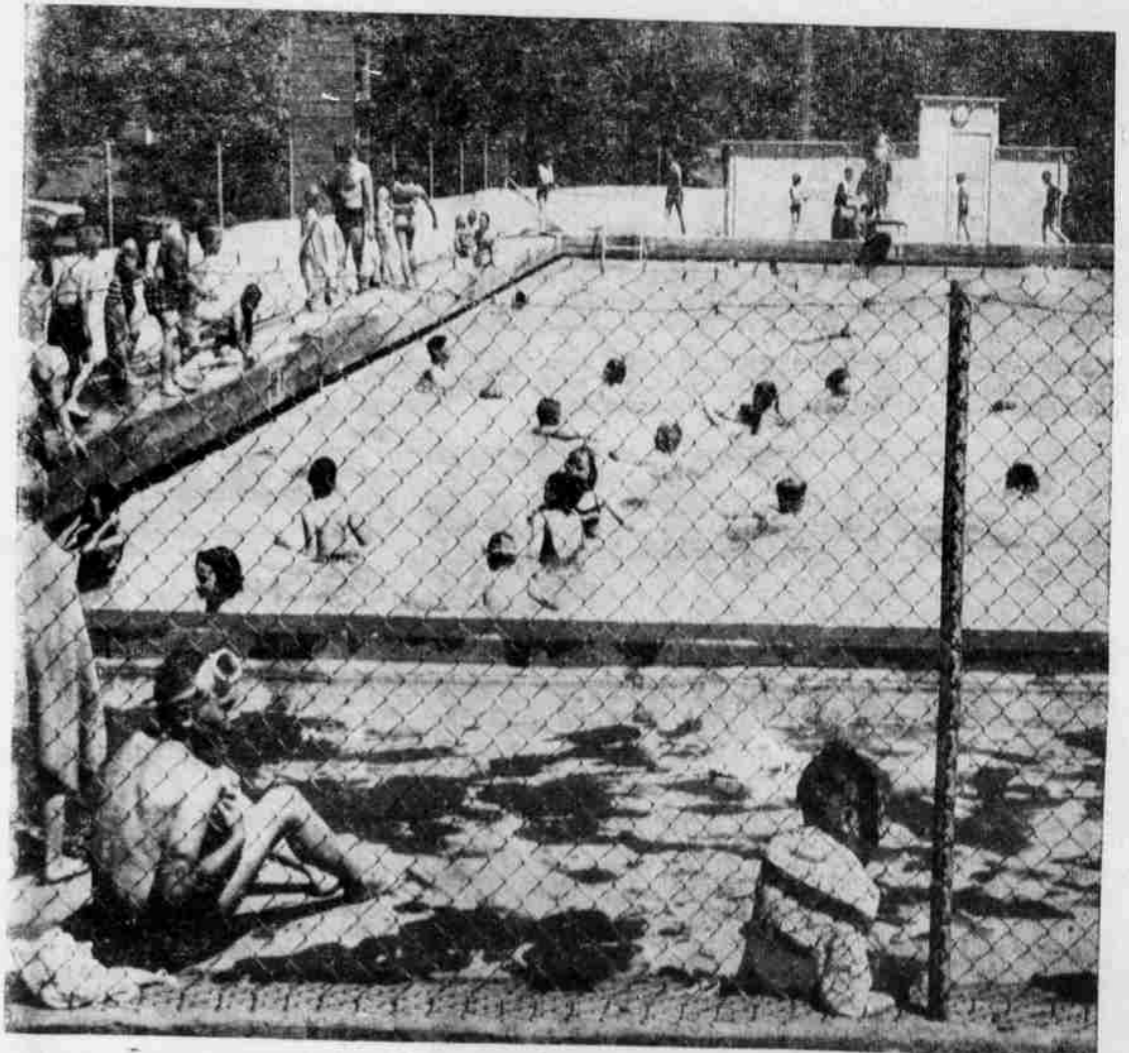
