Council Approves Lighting Plan

Ray Wooley and Russ Doran, representing Umatilla Electric Cooperative Association, met with the Irrigon City Council at their August council meeting to present a proposed pattern for street lighting through the City of Irrigon. The council studied the drawings which had been prepared, and voted unanimously to approve the proposed pattern. The plan must also be approved by the Oregon State Highway Department before the lights can be installed.

The plan calls for 10 lights to be installed in a zig-zag pattern on each side of the highway, and is the recommended lighting for medium highway traffic. Ordinance No. 9, an Ordinance regulating the parking of trailer houses and trailer coaches within the City of Irrigon and providing for license fees for trailer coach parks or camps, was read by title and passed unanimously. This Ordinance also repealed the former Trailer Ordinance No. 5.

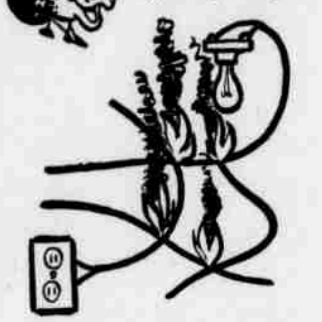
